


SUSK Assists with Mentoring Mitacs Ukrainian Student Interns

Over the course of the last few months, top ranked students from Ukraine had the opportunity to participate in Mitacs undergraduate research internships across Canada. Supported by the Shevchenko Foundation, approximately fifty students from Ukraine participated in 12-week research opportunities supervised by Canadian university faculty.

The Ukrainian Canadian Students' Union (SUSK) was able to assist the interns during their time in Canada and provide them with a welcoming environment and network of Ukrainian-Canadian students. SUSK also had the opportunity to attend meetings and presentations of the Mitacs students, where members of the board learned more about the research the interns had taken part in.


